The ever-increasing number of stray and neglected animals adds fuel to the cycle of abuse and suffering. Our key focus areas are:

# **Sterilisation**

 Sterilisation – we wish to sterilise as many animals as we can, as sterilisation will help curb the flow of stray and neglected animals. Each sterilisation costs R300 +, and donations towards sterilisations are critical for us to sterilise as many animals as possible every year.

Did you know?

South Africa has enough puppies/dogs already, and all the country really needs is enough people to love them. One female cat + her offspring can produce 420,000 cats in 7 years (source: HSUS). One female dog and her offspring can produce 67,000 dogs in 6 years (source: HSUS) that's why it's so important to sterilise your pets!

### Treatment and feeding

• We wish to help on a daily basis the stray, neglected, unwanted and abused paws as well as pet owners, to assist when animals have been injured, sick,



given birth or need help with food and caring for their animals. Our team aims to collect sick and injured animals, have them treated by a vet, and returned to the owner once the animal has recovered. Or in the case of feeding help the pet owner, whether it is by supplying food or helping the pet owner feed their animals. As for strays I hope is to Re home them to their perfect families

# **Education**

 We are planning on focusing on educating the pet owning public about sterilization and the positive outcome of proper nutrition, caring and wellbeing of all animals out there, As well as educating the communities about responsible animal care through appointments with any one of our team members.

### **Rescue and Rehoming**

 We aim to rescue as many Stray and abused animals as humanly possible to give them the second chance at a warm and happy life they need and deserve. The process will include a site visit to prospective new owner, official adoption documentation and ensuring that the pet is sterilized, healthy and up-to-date with all vaccinations.

- **Pro-active**: We will not sit around and wait for animals in need to come to us. Instead we will spend every free minute we have in the communities LOOKING for the animals that need help.
